**Game Stories**

**RECAP**  
 The Evansville Otters completed a home series sweep of the Lake Erie Crushers Thursday, winning with a walk-off in game one and winning a home run derby in game two. Game one ended with a score 2-1. The second game was tied at four after eight innings, and was decided by a 4-2 home-run derby finale. The Otters improve to 6-1 on the season. In game one, the Otters first fell behind after Lake Erie's Trevor Achenbach hit a solo shot off of Otters starter Dalton Stambaugh. Christopher Pujols answered the Crushers' tally with an RBI single in the bottom of the second inning that scored Riley Krane. Stambaugh impressed on the mound, throwing six innings while striking out six, walking one, and allowing four hits. The Achenbach home run was the only run allowed by Stambaugh. Abraham Almonte came out of the Otters' bullpen, and pitched a scoreless seventh before the game went to extras. The Otters played their first 2021 regular season game under the international tie-breaker rules when the game remained tied at one after seven innings. Almonte stayed on to pitch, getting a play that would cut down General McArthur --- the extra runner --- on a play at the plate, which kept the game tied going into the bottom of the eighth. In the bottom half, Trent Nash started off on second base. After two outs and two intentional walks, Elijah MacNamee came to the plate with the bases loaded and the winning run 90 feet from home. MacNamee won the game on a base hit into the right-center field gap. In game two, MacNamee opened the scoring with an RBI sacrifice fly to center that scored Miles Gordon, who had doubled to leadoff the inning, in the bottom of the first. Facing Otters' starter Tyler Vail, the Crushers tied the game in the top of the third with a sacrifice fly of their own. The Otters quickly regained the lead in the bottom half, when Andy DeJesus doubled home Gordon from third. The Otters' lead held until the fifth, when the Crushers scored three runs and took a 4-2 lead. Tyler Vail would remain in the ballgame, however, and bounced back to keep the Crushers to within two through his seven innings on the mound. Evansville found a way to tie things up in the bottom of the seventh, which John Schultz led off with a double to left. Following a J.R. Davis walk and a Dakota Phillips base hit to load the bases, the Otters cut the deficit in half when Trent Nash, a pinch runner, scored on fielder's choice. Then, Otters skipper Andy McCauley ordered up a safety squeeze from Josh Henderson, who laid down a perfect bunt to the right of the mound and allowed Davis to score from third and tie the game. Evansville closer Logan Sawyer came on in the eighth, with the international tie-breaker rule in play. Dylan Jones, the extra runner, advanced to third on a fielding error that allowed Shawun Dunston, Jr. to reach first safely. Following a stolen base, Sawyer proceeded to strand both runners in scoring position by striking out the next three batters 1-2-3. Evansville was unable to score in the bottom of the eighth, so the Otters would have their first ever Home Run Derby finale to determine a winner in game two. After Lake Erie's Dunston Jr. failed to hit a homer, Riley Krane began the Otters' turn at the derby with two home runs to right field. Lake Erie's Trevor Achenbach would tie it at two home runs, and Dakota Phillips broke the tie with two home runs of his own.

## Otters Game Notes

### McCauley's 11th Season

Andy McCauley has been the Otters' manager since 2010. He increased his managerial records in Otters' history in 2019, sitting first in franchise history in regular season wins (474) and games managed (910). McCauley's win total including post-season victories stands at 481 entering the 2021 season. McCauley's career win total stands at 976. McCauley has led Evansville to five postseason appearances, including the 2016 Frontier League Championship season. He was the 2014 Roger Hanners Award winner for Frontier League Manager of the Year after he guided Evansville to the playoffs that season for the first time since 2006. McCauley accepted the manager's position on July 6, 2010. McCauley guided the Otters to postseason appearances with 52 wins in 2017, 51 wins in 2018, and a franchise-tying record of 57 wins in 2019 and the franchise's first Frontier League division title since 1999. McCauley has managed in the Frontier League before. In 1998, he became the skipper for the Kalamazoo Kodiaks. The next season, McCauley managed the London Werewolves, another Frontier League team, to a 54-30 record and a league championship. McCauley has also had success in the Northern League from 2002-09 with the Quebec Capitales, Schaumburg Flyers and Kansas City T-Bones. It was with Kansas City that he also won another league championship in 2008. McCauley is a 1991 graduate of Mansfield (Pa.) University.

### New Year, New Look

The Evansville Otters will sport new uniforms for the 2021 season. The unveiling of new uniforms follows the franchise's logo rebrand in March. The new home white set features a blue, script 'Otters' wordmark across the front, pairing with a blue-white cap featuring script 'E' insignias on the front. The set also includes crisp, white pants with blue belts and socks. Road grays mark the return of 'Evansville' across the chest, as the preceding jersey combinations all had 'Otters' across the front. The script 'Evansville' wordmark will proudly display the Otters' hometown, when the team travels around the Frontier League. Last, the uniform rotation is rounded out by blue alternate jersey tops, which can be worn both at home and on the road. The alternates have a cream-white 'Otters' script wordmark across the front. The strong presence of blue by the Otters' new logo and uniforms pays tribute to the early days of the Evansville Triplets the colors they initially wore. The Triplets also had a long stint and baseball history in Evansville. The colors and classic, scripted wordmarks are deeply rooted within the tradition of common baseball typefaces. While the Otters continued to wear their previous uniforms for the duration of Spring Training, they will eagerly begin the 2021 Frontier League regular season in their new "unis." The color scheme also gives the team a brighter, more eye-popping presence on the field.

### New Logo

The Evansville Otters unveiled a collection of newly designed logos last March, giving the baseball team a fresh, rebranded look heading into the 2021 Frontier League regular season. "This is an exciting time for the Otters franchise, coming off our 25th anniversary in 2019, Bosse Field's renovations in 2020, and now, new branding heading into the Otters' return to the field in 2021," Otters president John Stanley stated. "Now seemed like the perfect time to refresh some things." The new primary logo features updated, brighter color variations of the Otters' traditional red and blue scheme, while also adding a light, watery blue and a warm, white hide. The main logo also introduced a new typography, showcasing an emphasis on "Evansville" in the visual to signify the dedication to community and local team pride. Plus, the wordmarks present a contemporary, custom script that pays homage to baseball's classic typeface. The otter mascot in the team logo also received an updated look, displaying a serious game face, but with soft curves and a two-dimensional style to make him friendly and fun – in the true spirit of an otter. "The biggest differences with our new logo are that it is brighter and has more contrast, the lines are not as harsh and are smoother, and of course, our new Otter," Otters director of communications Preston Leinenbach said. "We feel our fans will connect more with this otter mascot logo. Plus, the Evansville script represents our goal to illustrate that the Otters are Evansville's professional baseball team."

## Otters Game Notes

### New CEO

Jon Danos joins the Frontier League this season as its Chief Executive Officer. Jon most recently served as Executive Director of Athletics at his alma mater, the University of New Hampshire. From 2003 to 2014, Jon was partner, president and chief operating officer of Opening Day Partners which owned and launched four Atlantic League teams: in Sugar Land, TX, (recently appointed AAA affiliate of the Houston Astros), York and Lancaster, Pennsylvania and Waldorf, Maryland. During that time, Jon and his partners collaborated with communities to construct over \$120 million of ballparks that have become essential to quality of life and a source of community events and local pride. He spent all his years in the Atlantic League serving on its Board of Directors. Prior to Opening Day Partners, Jon was an executive with Maryland Baseball, LLC which owned and operated three affiliates of the Baltimore Orioles in Frederick, Bowie and Salisbury, Maryland as well as facilities management and concessions companies. He started his front office baseball career upon graduating from the University of New Hampshire in 1990. Jon, his wife Laura, twin sons Christopher and Luca, who will both play college baseball beginning next year, and daughter Ava, live in Hampton Falls, New Hampshire.

### Playing Equipe Quebec

The Otters will welcome the newly formed merger squad "Equipe Quebec" to Evansville for its home opener on Saturday, May 29. Due to the uncertainty regarding the reopening of the United States-Canadian border, the Frontier League regretfully announced that the Ottawa Titans and Trois-Rivieres Aigles will not field teams for the 2021 season. To complete the 2021 schedule, a team from the Province of Quebec was formed by the Aigles and Capitales and will be managed by Pat Scalabrini, manager of the Quebec Capitales. "With the continued closure of the U.S./Canada border and the uncertainty of when it will reopen, the Ottawa Titans in conjunction with the Frontier League have agreed to

make 2022 our inaugural season," said Titans' vice-president Regan Katz. "This was not an easy decision, but we believe it is the right decision. We thank our staff, players, coaches, and manager for their commitment to the Ottawa Titans and look forward to seeing them on our field next May." Equipe Quebec is composed of the Canadian players from the Titans, Aigles, and Capitales' current rosters along with the remaining players under contract to Quebec. Non-Canadian players on the Ottawa and Trois-Rivieres rosters were subject to a dispersal draft among the 13 United States-based teams last April. The new team will spend the first half of the 2021 season on the road and visit each of the 13 other stadiums, beginning at Gateway on May 27. Should the border open, they will play what would have been their home games at Stade Canac in Quebec City and Stade Quillorama in Trois-Rivieres. Up to 27 home games are possible. If the border has not reopened by July 23, these games will be played at the opponent's stadium. "It is a situation completely out of our control," said Trois-Rivieres president Rene Martin. "We cannot wait to play in the Frontier League in 2022. One of our main goals was to present professional baseball in Trois-Rivieres and Quebec this summer, and should the border reopen that option remains."

### MLB Partner

The Evansville Otters, a member team of the Frontier League, a Professional Baseball League of 14 teams throughout the U.S. and Canada, announced this offseason that they are now a Partner League of Major League Baseball (MLB). "We welcome the Frontier League as a Partner League and look forward to working with them toward our shared goal of expanding the geographic reach of baseball," said Morgan Sword, Executive Vice President of Baseball Economics & Operations, MLB. "The Evansville Otters are thrilled to now have a partnership arrangement with Major League Baseball," said Otters President John Stanley. "The relationship with MLB is a first for the Frontier League

### Dakota Phillips in Sugarland

In 2020, Dakota Phillips found a way to play baseball despite the challenges of that year. The Nacogdoches native took advantage of an opportunity to participate in the start-up Constellation Energy League in Sugarland, Texas. Four teams (Sugarland Skeeters, Sugarland Lightning Sloths, Eastern Reyes del Tigre, and Team Texas) met at Constellation Field for a scheduled 28-game schedule. Phillips played for the Lightning Sloths, under former major league All-Star and 17-year veteran Greg Swindell, as well \_\_\_\_\_. Phillips attributed invaluable lessons to his time in Sugarland, including new mindsets for pitch calling as well as facing opposing pitchers. He played alongside major league talents like David Huff, (CLE-NYY-SFG-LAD-LAA, '09-16, LHP), Robbie Ross (TEX-BOS, '12-17, LHP), Zac Rosscup (CHC-COL-LAD-SEA-TOR, '13-15, '17-19, LHP), Dalton Pompey (TOR, '14-16, '18, OF), Johnny Barbato (NYY-PIT-DET, '16-18, RHP), Greg Mahle (LAA, 2016, LHP, brother of Tyler Mahle), and others. The Lightning Sloths' roster also included former early round draft picks like Barrett Barnes (1st Rd, PIT, 2012), Kelly Dugan (2nd Rd, PHI, 2009), Lucas Erceg (2nd Rd, MIL, 2016), and Grant Gambrell (3rd Rd, KCR, 2019). Phillips also faced former big league pitchers like Scott Kazmir, Bud Norris, and Fernando Rodney while with the Lightning Sloths, performing well against difficult competition. Through the first month of play, Phillips was hitting .348 with his temporary club, until the lingering effects of a heat stroke helped to induce an 0-6 hitless streak in his final two games. Phillips still managed to end his summer with a commendable .276 batting average from behind the plate, while also belting two home runs, which both came off of big league arms: Aaron Blair and Anthony Vasquez. Since then, the Sugarland Skeeters have been picked up as the AAA farm club of the Houston Astros.

### Streaming Platform

The Frontier League of Professional Baseball announced that it has reached an agreement with Vimeo to livestream all 2021 regular season and playoff games. Live and archived games will be available through [www.frontierleaguetelevision.com](http://www.frontierleaguetelevision.com) and through the new Frontier League app for Apple and Android devices. "Providing a centralized streaming platform for fans was a priority for our league," said deputy commissioner Steve Tahsler. "We intend to create more and more compelling content among our teams moving forward as a Major League Baseball Partner League to enable our growing number of fans to engage with the Frontier League. As the largest of the Partner Leagues, we want all fans across our wide geographical footprint to have access." All 672 regular season games plus all Frontier League playoff games will be livestreamed, beginning with the Opening Day broadcasts on Thursday, May 27 featuring Équipe Québec at Gateway; Evansville at Schaumburg, Washington at Florence, New Jersey at New York, Southern Illinois at Lake Erie, Joliet at Windy City, and Tri-City at Sussex County. Fans can enjoy a free trial of the service through May 31. Beginning with games on Tuesday, June 1, season-long subscriptions enabling subscribers to view all games, will be available for \$49.99 with monthly subscriptions available for \$24.99. All broadcasts will feature high-quality cameras and unique graphics packages. Leading up to the regular season, select Frontier League exhibition games will be broadcast as well. Exhibition games currently scheduled for broadcast include Équipe Québec at Gateway on Friday morning; Southern Illinois at Evansville and the Lexington Legends of the Atlantic League at Florence on Friday evening; and Lake Erie at Washington at Lake Erie on Saturday evening.

### Andy DeJesus and the ISU Sycamores

After spending two years at Iowa Central Community College in Fort Dodge, Iowa, Andy DeJesus transferred over to Indiana State University in Terre Haute, Indiana, for his NCAA junior and senior-eligible seasons. There, he played under Head Coach Mitch Hannahs, who has helmed the program since 2013. In 2016, DeJesus, along with fellow Sycamores Andrew Young and Hunter Owen, advanced to the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament semifinals. Young, drafted in the 37th Round of the 2016 first-year player draft by the St. Louis Cardinals and later traded to the Diamondbacks in December of 2018 in a deal that sent current big leaguers and former Cardinals Luke Weaver and Carson Kelly to the Dbacks in exchange for Paul Goldschmidt. Young debuted for the Diamondbacks in 2020, and has appeared in 26 games this season for Arizona. He's compiled 7 hits in 60 at-bats, but was optioned back to AAA Reno on May, 29th. Hunter Owen, also DeJesus' teammate in 2016 at ISU, was drafted in the 25th Round by the Pittsburgh Pirates, and made his MLB debut this May, logging 4 at-bats in 3 games. He has since been optioned back to AAA Indy. Owen is a graduate of Mater Dei High School in Evansville, and played with Otters' Clubhouse Manager Ben \_\_\_\_\_. DeJesus stays in touch with his former teammates, watching their exploits closely. He's also kept tabs on his Terre Haute alma mater, recently wishing them luck ahead of their appearance in the NCAA's Nashville Regional Tournament, where they will compete with Presbyterian College (#4) of Clinton, South Carolina, Georgia Tech (#2), and Vanderbilt (#1). As the number 3 seed, ISU will first play Georgia Tech on Friday at 2 p.m. from Hawkins Field at Vanderbilt. The tournament will be double elimination, and is paired with the Greenville Regional hosted by the East Carolina Pirates heading into the Super-Regional.

**#22 Andy McCauley, Manager (11th Season)** - McCauley has been the Otters' manager since 2010, leading the team to five postseason appearances and the 2016 Frontier League championship. He was the 2014 Roger Hanners Award winner for Frontier League Manager of the Year after he guided Evansville to the playoffs that season for the first time since 2006. McCauley accepted the manager's position on July 6, 2010. McCauley has managed in the Frontier League before. In 1998, he became the skipper for the Kalamazoo Kodiaks. The next season, McCauley managed the London Werewolves, another Frontier League team, to a 54-30 record and a league championship. McCauley has also had success in the Northern League from 2002-09 with the Quebec Capitales, Schaumburg Flyers and Kansas City T-Bones. It was with Kansas City that he also won another league championship in 2008. McCauley is a 1991 graduate of Mansfield (Pa.) University.

**#33 Bobby Segal, Hitting Coach (5th Season)** - Segal, a former catcher at Indiana University, is in his fifth season as hitting coach for the Otters and sixth year overall in professional baseball. In his first season in Evansville, Segal guided the Otters to solid offensive numbers with a team batting average of .270. The Otters scored 483 runs and finished with 73 home runs and 422 RBIs as a team in the regular season. While making stops at Union College (2008-09), Butler University (2010), Iowa Western College (2011), Tarleton State University (2012) and Wabash Valley College (2013-16), his teams have earned six national rankings and made five appearances in national postseason tournaments. After his playing days, Day managed the Detroit Tigers' rookie team, the Otters in 1995 and teams in the Cleveland Indians' minor league system. The New York native has also been a hitting instructor for the Cardinals and Kansas City Royals organizations, as well as the hitting coach most recently for the Normal CornBelters of the Frontier League in 2011. He guided the Otters to a 31-38 record as the franchise's first manager in 1995.

**#26 Max Peterson, Pitching Coach, (7th Season)** - San Diego native Max Peterson is in his seventh season as the team's pitching coach. Peterson is a five-year veteran of minor league baseball and is a former 18th round pick of the Oakland Athletics. He pitched three years in the A's organization and another two with the Chicago White Sox. He also has Frontier League playing experience, saving 12 games for the Southern Illinois Miners in 2012. In 2014, his first professional season as a coach, Peterson piloted Evansville to the playoffs for the first time since 2006 and a 3.30 earned run average, which was lowest in the Frontier League. The Otters yielded a league-low 46 home runs and accumulated a league-high 788 strikeouts. During the 2016 championship season, the Otters finished with a team ERA of 3.97 and 721 strikeouts. In 2019, Peterson was given the Darren Bush Frontier League Coach of the Year Award. Peterson's guidance led six Otters' pitchers to being signed to MLB affiliated organizations. Peterson also led the Otters' pitching staff to a franchise single season record of 868 strikeouts, which led the Frontier League. The franchise's last record-setting mark was 832 in 2017.

**#5 Phil Britton, Catching Instructor (9th Season)** - Phil Britton has been an Otters catcher and spring training instructor since 2012. The Olney, Ill. native played for the Otters in 2011, hitting .262 with two home runs and 15 RBIs. Britton played professional baseball for seven seasons including five with the Atlanta Braves' organization and two years with the Baltimore Orioles. He played as high as Class AAA with Norfolk of the Orioles' organization in 2010.

**#25 Billy Easley, Assistant Coach & Player Procurement, (1st Season)** - Billy Easley has been an assistant coach at NAIA Oklahoma City University for the last six seasons. Since joining OCU, Easley has helped coach two All-Americans and three professional catchers. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Radio/Television/Video from the University of the Ozark's and a Master's degree in positive coaching from the University of Missouri.
