Game Stories

RECAP

Evansville lost early leads in both billings of a doubleheader Sunday to suffer a series sweep at the hands of the Schaumburg Boomers at Bosse Field. The Otters dropped game one by a 7-5 score, though they had been set to a large early lead. The Otters scored five runs in the bottom of the second, thanks to a 3-2, two-out RBI single from Miles Gordon and back-to-back home runs from Andy DeJesus (for three runs) and J.R. Davis. The Boomers shot right back in the top of the third for five of their own off Otters starter Braden Scott. Alberto Schmidt opened the Schaumburg scoring with a two-run homer to left that was followed in the inning by a Quincy Nieporte sacrifice fly and Angelo Gumbs' two-run double. Quincy Nieporte crushed the Otters on the day, driving in two more runs for the Boomers in game one. Nieporte added his second RBI of the day in the top of fifth with a run-scoring single off Otters reliever Tyler Spring, who had just come in to relieve Braden Scott with no one out and two aboard. Nieporte would cap off game one's scoring with his first home run of the day in the top of the seventh, pushing the Boomers lead to 7-5, where the score would hold for the final. Isaiah Rivera would earn the win, while Darrell Thompson picked up his fourth save of the season. Braden Scott took the loss. Game two also began the way of the Boomers, when Nieporte smashed a two-run home run to left field that gave the Boomers a 2-0 lead in the top of the first. Evansville answered right back in their opening at-bats, scoring four runs in the inning. J.R. Davis opened the Otters' scoring with an RBI-single, followed by an RBI fielder's choice from Riley Krane. Elijah MacNamee followed Krane's at-bat with an opposite field home run to right, giving the Otters a 4-2. The score would hold until the top of the fifth, when Quincy Neiporte hit his third home run of the day --- and second of the game --- against Austin Gossmann, tying the game at four. Taylor Wright would get the final two outs of the inning after coming on to relieve Gossmann with two aboard, keeping the game tied. Evansville took the lead right back in the bottom of the fifth, when Bryce Denton, who doubled to lead off the inning, scored from third on a two-out, 0-2 RBI single from J.R. Davis. Evansville then led 5-4. Schaumburg would stun the Otters in the top of the seventh inning however, as closer Logan Sawyer came on in the hopes of earning his tenth save of the season. Proving to be Evansville's achilles heel, Quincy Nieporte would reach on a leadoff walk and score on a throwing error by the pitcher. Three more runs would come in to score during the innings, on an RBI single, groundout, and sac fly. Evansville managed to score one run in the bottom of the seventh on an RBI double by Andy DeJesus and bring the tying run to the plate, but Jake Joyce succeeded in earning his third save of the season. Thomas Nicoll earned the win, while Logan Sawyer took the loss.

Otters Game Notes

Starter Sneak Peak:

The Otters will send stopper Polo Portela to the mound Tuesday night, coming off a seven inning, one-run performance against the Joliet Slammers Wednesday, July 7th at Bosse Field, striking out eight and scattering four hits. The Otters are 8-0 this season when Portela takes the hill. Portela enters tonight's game tied for the league lead in wins (5), and remains the only opening day starter still in the rotation outside Tyler Vail, who is working his way back from injury.

McCauley's 11th Season

Andy McCauley has been the Otters' manager since 2010. He increased his managerial records in Otters' history in 2019, sitting first in franchise history in regular season wins (474) and games managed (910). McCauley's win total including post-season victories stands at 481 entering the 2021 season. McCauley's career win total stood at 976. McCauley has led Evansville to five postseason appearances, including the 2016 Frontier League Championship season. He was the 2014 Roger Hanners Award winner for Frontier League Manager of the Year after he guided Evansville to the playoffs that season for the first time since 2006. McCauley accepted the manager's position on July 6, 2010. McCauley guided the Otters to postseason appearances with 52 wins in 2017, 51 wins in 2018, and a franchise-tying record of 57 wins in 2019 and the franchise's first Frontier League division title since 1999. McCauley has managed in the Frontier League before. In 1998, he became the skipper for the Kalamazoo Kodiaks. The next season, McCauley managed the London Werewolves, another Frontier League team, to a 54-30 record and a league championship. McCauley has also had success in the Northern League from 2002-09 with the Quebec Capitales, Schaumburg Flyers and Kansas City T-Bones. It was with Kansas City that he also won another league championship in 2008. McCauley is a 1991 graduate of Mansfield (Pa.) University.

New Year, New Look

The Evansville Otters will sport new uniforms for the 2021 season. The unveiling of new uniforms follows the franchise's logo rebrand in March. The new home white set features a blue, script 'Otters' wordmark across the front, pairing with a blue-white cap featuring script 'E' insignias on the front. The set also includes crisp, white pants with blue belts and socks. Road grays mark the return of 'Evansville' across the chest, as the preceding jersey combinations all had 'Otters' across the front. The script 'Evansville' wordmark will proudly display the Otters' hometown, when the team travels around the Frontier League. Last, the uniform rotation is rounded out by blue alternate jersey tops, which can be worn both at home and on the road. The alternates have a cream-white 'Otters' script wordmark across the front. The strong presence of blue by the Otters' new logo and uniforms pays tribute to the early days of the Evansville Triplets the colors they initially wore. The Triplets also had a long stint and baseball history in Evansville. The colors and classic, scripted wordmarks are deeply rooted within the tradition of common baseball typefaces. While the Otters continued to wear their previous uniforms for the duration of Spring Training, they will eagerly begin the 2021 Frontier League regular season in their new "unis." The color scheme also gives the team a brighter, more eye-popping presence on the field.

Otters Game Notes

New Logo

The Evansville Otters unveiled a collection of newly designed logos last March, giving the baseball team a fresh, rebranded look heading into the 2021 Frontier League regular season. “This is an exciting time for the Otters franchise, coming off our 25th anniversary in 2019, Bosse Field’s renovations in 2020, and now, new branding heading into the Otters’ return to the field in 2021,” Otters president John Stanley stated. “Now seemed like the perfect time to refresh some things.” The new primary logo features updated, brighter color variations of the Otters’ traditional red and blue scheme, while also adding a light, watery blue and a warm, white hide. The main logo also introduced a new typography, showcasing an emphasis on “Evansville” in the visual to signify the dedication to community and local team pride. Plus, the wordmarks present a contemporary, custom script that pays homage to baseball’s classic typeface. The otter mascot in the team logo also received an updated look, displaying a serious game face, but with soft curves and a two-dimensional style to make him friendly and fun – in the true spirit of an otter. “The biggest differences with our new logo are that it is brighter and has more contrast, the lines are not as harsh and are smoother, and of course, our new Otter,” Otters director of communications Preston Leinenbach said. “We feel our fans will connect more with this otter mascot logo. Plus, the Evansville script represents our goal to illustrate that the Otters are Evansville’s professional baseball team.”

MLB Partner

The Evansville Otters, a member team of the Frontier League, a Professional Baseball League of 14 teams throughout the U.S. and Canada, announced this offseason that they are now a Partner League of Major League Baseball (MLB). “We welcome the Frontier League as a Partner League and look forward to working with them toward our shared goal of expanding the geographic reach of baseball,” said Morgan Sword, Executive Vice President of Baseball Economics & Operations, MLB. “The Evansville Otters are thrilled to now have a partnership arrangement with Major League Baseball,” said Otters President John Stanley. “The relationship with MLB is a first for the Frontier League and the Otters. Initially, there will be several opportunities to partner on community-related baseball promotions that will benefit the Otters and the community. It is pleasing to know that MLB chose only three Independent Leagues to be in the partnership group. There is excitement surrounding this partnership throughout the baseball world and we are anxious to get started with MLB.” The Frontier League, as a designated MLB Partner League, will collaborate with MLB to jointly discuss marketing and promotional initiatives to grow, expand, and enhance the game of baseball.

Pro-Ball Back in Evansville

Following the postponement of the 2020 Frontier League season, professional baseball returned to Evansville and the historic Bosse Field after a year-long hiatus on May 29th, as the Evansville Otters welcomed l’Equipe Quebec for the doubleheader home opener. Professional baseball in Evansville dates back to 1884, formerly played at the Louisiana Street Grounds, until the completion of Bosse Field in 1915. On June 15, 1915, the Evansville Evas claimed victory over the Erie Sailors in a 4-0 shutout in front of 8,000+ fans. The only two currently operating ballparks older than Bosse Field are Fenway Park (1912) and Wrigley Field (1914). Over 100 Hall of Fame baseball players have set foot on Bosse Field, and a number have played for pro-teams while representing the city of Evansville. Hall of Fame ballplayers who have represented the City of Evansville at Bosse Field include

Chuck Klein, Hank Greenberg, Warren Spahn, Jack Morris, Bert Blyleven, and Ford C. Frick Award Winner Bob Uecker. Edd Roush also played for the Evansville Evas (River Rats) in 1912-1913, before Bosse Field was built. Other notable players to take the field for Evansville at Bosse Field include Kirk Gibson and Oakland A’s manager Bob Melvin.

McCauley’s 1000th

Friday night Otters’ skipper Andy McCauley garnered his 1,000th win as a manager in professional baseball. He entered the 2021 season with 976 wins through 23 years working as a pro-ball manager. The current tally sits at a square 1,000, dating back to his 1998 season with the Kalamazoo Kodiaks. He won his first Frontier League Championship back in 1999 with the London Werewolves, before winning his second with the Otters in 2016. McCauley also won a championship in the Northern League, managing the Kansas City T-Bones in 2008.

Dakota Phillips in Sugarland

In 2020, Dakota Phillips found a way to play baseball despite the challenges of that year. The Nacogdoches native took advantage of an opportunity to participate in the start-up Constellation Energy League in Sugarland, Texas. Four teams (Sugarland Skeeters, Sugarland Lightning Sloths, Eastern Reyes del Tigre, and Team Texas) met at Constellation Field for a scheduled 28-game schedule. Phillips played for the Lightning Sloths, under former major league All-Star and 17-year veteran Greg Swindell. Phillips attributed invaluable lessons to his time in Sugarland, including new mindsets for pitch calling as well as facing opposing pitchers. He played alongside major league talents like David Huff, (CLE-NYY-SFG-LAD-LAA, '09-16, LHP), Robbie Ross (TEX-BOS, '12-17, LHP), Zac Rosscup (CHC-COL-LAD-SEA-TOR, '13-15, '17-19, LHP), Dalton Pompey (TOR, '14-16, '18, OF), Johnny Barbato (NYY-PIT-DET, '16-18, RHP), Greg Mahle (LAA, 2016, LHP, brother of Tyler Mahle), and others. The Lightning Sloths' roster also included former early round draft picks like Barrett Barnes (1st Rd, PIT, 2012), Kelly Dugan (2nd Rd, PHI, 2009), Lucas Erceg (2nd Rd, MIL, 2016), and Grant Gambrell (3rd Rd, KCR, 2019). Phillips also faced former big league pitchers like Scott Kazmir, Bud Norris, and Fernando Rodney while with the Lightning Sloths, performing well against difficult competition. Through the first month of play, Phillips was hitting .348 with his temporary club, until the lingering effects of a heat stroke helped to induce an 0-6 hitless streak in his final two games. Phillips still managed to end his summer with a commendable .276 batting average from behind the plate, while also belting two home runs, one of which came off a big league arm: Aaron Blair. Since then, the Sugarland Skeeters have been picked up as the AAA farm club of the Houston Astros.

Streaming Platform

The Frontier League of Professional Baseball announced that it has reached an agreement with Vimeo to livestream all 2021 regular season and playoff games. Live and archived games will be available through www.frontierleaguetelevision.com and through the new Frontier League app for Apple and Android devices. "Providing a centralized streaming platform for fans was a priority for our league," said deputy commissioner Steve Tahsler. "We intend to create more and more compelling content among our teams moving forward as a Major League Baseball Partner League to enable our growing number of fans to engage with the Frontier League. As the largest of the Partner Leagues, we want all fans across our wide geographical footprint to have access." All 672 regular season games plus all Frontier League playoff games will be livestreamed, beginning with the Opening Day broadcasts on Thursday, May 27 featuring Équipe Québec at Gateway; Evansville at Schaumburg, Washington at Florence, New Jersey at New York, Southern Illinois at Lake Erie, Joliet at Windy City, and Tri-City at Sussex County. Fans can enjoy a free trial of the service through May 31. Beginning with games on Tuesday, June 1, season-long subscriptions enabling subscribers to view all games, will be available for \$49.99 with monthly subscriptions available for \$24.99. All broadcasts will feature high-quality cameras and unique graphics packages. Leading up to the regular season, select Frontier League exhibition games will be broadcast as well. Exhibition games currently scheduled for broadcast include Équipe Québec at Gateway on Friday morning; Southern Illinois at Evansville and the Lexington Legends of the Atlantic League at Florence on Friday evening; and Lake Erie at Washington at Lake Erie on Saturday evening.

Stambaugh Signed

Evansville Otters starting pitcher Dalton Stambaugh was signed by the Chicago Cubs on Saturday, June 19th. Dalton Stambaugh, from Fredericksburg, Ohio, signed and joined the Otters heading into the 2021 season. The left-hander brought with him previous affiliated baseball experience with the Baltimore Orioles organization. Stambaugh went 2-0 with a 3.57 ERA, while striking out 24 batters in 22.2 innings pitched with the Otters this season. His last win came against the Schaumburg Boomers on June 13. In the outing, Stambaugh struck out seven and went 6.2 innings pitched. "I'm very excited for this new opportunity and can't wait to get started," Stambaugh said. "I'm looking forward to representing the Cubs organization and helping in any way I can. I'm also looking forward to building new relationships and meeting new people." The signing will be the latest stint in affiliated baseball for Stambaugh. Stambaugh was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles organization in the 30th round of the 2019 MLB June Amateur Draft out of Morehead State University. He went on to pitch in 2019 with Gulf Coast League Orioles. "We are very happy for Dalton getting this opportunity with the Cubs," Otters manager Andy McCauley said. "He certainly deserves it." "We wish Dalton the best of luck with the Cubs organization." Stambaugh is the first Otters player from the 2021 season to be signed to an affiliated organization. Former Otters pitchers Randy McCurry and Chris Nunn were the last from Evansville to sign with the Cubs organization in 2017. "It goes without saying that Mr. Bussing's commitment has allowed me to acquire and retain the best coaching staff in all of minor league baseball," McCauley said. "All of our assistant coaches – Boots (Day), Bobby (Segal), Billy (Easley) and Max (Peterson) – have put in so much work to help elevate our guys to the next level." McCauley also said having the history and proven ability of his coaching staff to get players signed into affiliated baseball helps recruit new players to Evansville. The Otters have sent 82 players to affiliated organizations out of Evansville.

He was the 2014 Roger Hanners Award winner for Frontier League Manager of the Year after he guided Evansville to the playoffs that season for the first time since 2006. McCauley accepted the manager's position on July 6, 2010. McCauley has managed in the Frontier League before. In 1998, he became the skipper for the Kalamazoo Kodiaks. The next season, McCauley managed the London Werewolves, another Frontier League team, to a 54-30 record and a league championship. McCauley has also had success in the Northern League from 2002-09 with the Quebec Capitales, Schaumburg Flyers and Kansas City T-Bones. It was with Kansas City that he also won another league championship in 2008. McCauley is a 1991 graduate of Mansfield (Pa.) University.

#33 Bobby Segal, Hitting Coach (5th Season) - Segal, a former catcher at Indiana University, is in his fifth season as hitting coach for the Otters and sixth year overall in professional baseball. In his first season in Evansville, Segal guided the Otters to solid offensive numbers with a team batting average of .270. The Otters scored 483 runs and finished with 73 home runs and 422 RBIs as a team in the regular season. While making stops at Union College (2008-09), Butler University (2010), Iowa Western College (2011), Tarleton State University (2012) and Wabash Valley College (2013-16), his teams have earned six national rankings and made five appearances in national postseason tournaments. He was named the Darren Bush Frontier League Coach of the Year following the 2017 season in Evansville.

#3 Charles "Boots" Day, Bench Coach (10th Season) - Day is in his tenth season as a coach with the Otters. He was the Frontier League Coach of the Year in 2012. Day played Major League Baseball as an outfielder for the St. Louis Cardinals, Chicago Cubs and Montreal Expos during a six-year stint. In 1971, his best season, Day hit .283 with four home runs and 33 RBIs for the Expos. He also played for the Evansville Triplets from 1975-78. After his playing days, Day managed the Detroit Tigers' rookie team, the Otters in 1995 and teams in the Cleveland Indians' minor league system. The New York native has also been a hitting instructor for the Cardinals and Kansas City Royals organizations, as well as the hitting coach most recently for the Normal CornBelters of the Frontier League in 2011. He guided the Otters to a 31-38 record as the franchise's first manager in 1995.

#26 Max Peterson, Pitching Coach, (7th Season) - San Diego native Max Peterson is in his seventh season as the team's pitching coach. Peterson is a five-year veteran of minor league baseball and is a former 18th round pick of the Oakland Athletics. He pitched three years in the A's organization and another two with the Chicago White Sox. He also has Frontier League playing experience, saving 12 games for the Southern Illinois Miners in 2012. In 2014, his first professional season as a coach, Peterson piloted Evansville to the playoffs for the first time since 2006 and a 3.30 earned run average, which was lowest in the Frontier League. The Otters yielded a league-low 46 home runs and accumulated a league-high 788 strikeouts. During the 2016 championship season, the Otters finished with a team ERA of 3.97 and 721 strikeouts. In 2019, Peterson was given the Darren Bush Frontier League Coach of the Year Award. Peterson's guidance led six Otters' pitchers to being signed to MLB affiliated organizations. Peterson also led the Otters' pitching staff to a franchise single season record of 868 strikeouts, which led the Frontier League. The franchise's last record-setting mark was 832 in 2017.

#5 Phil Britton, Catching Instructor (9th Season) - Phil Britton has been an Otters catcher and spring training instructor since 2012. The Olney, Ill. native played for the Otters in 2011, hitting .262 with two home runs and 15 RBIs. Britton played professional baseball for seven seasons including five with the Atlanta Braves' organization and two years with the Baltimore Orioles. He played as high as Class AAA with Norfolk of the Orioles' organization in 2010.

#25 Billy Easley, Assistant Coach & Player Procurement, (1st Season) - Billy Easley has been an assistant coach at NAIA Oklahoma City University for the last six seasons. Since joining OCU, Easley has helped coach two All-Americans and three professional catchers. He earned his Bachelor's degree in Radio/Television/Video from the University of the Ozarks and a Master's degree in positive coaching from the University of Missouri.
